Julian D. Ford, Ph.D., A.B.P.P. will describe the translation of neuroscience and psychotherapy research into a framework for understanding and intervening preventively and clinically to help children, adults, and families to recover from the complex impact of psychological trauma on health, mental health, relationships, and quality of life. The central role of emotion regulation and dysregulation in complex trauma and recovery will be highlighted, and an evidence-based practical approach to education and therapy for trauma survivors will be described with brief anonymized case examples.
